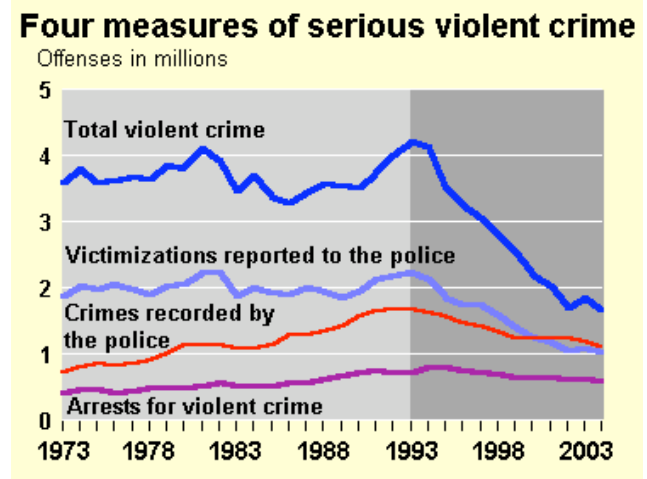
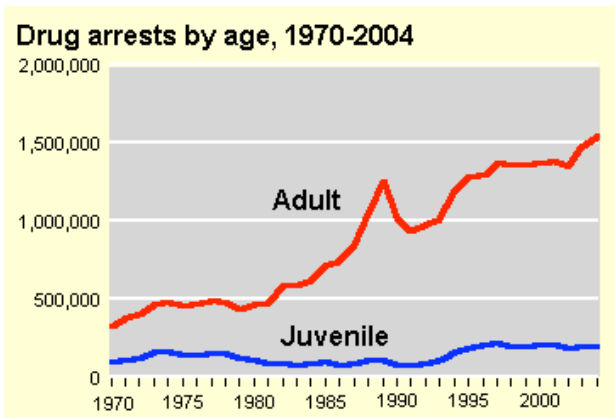

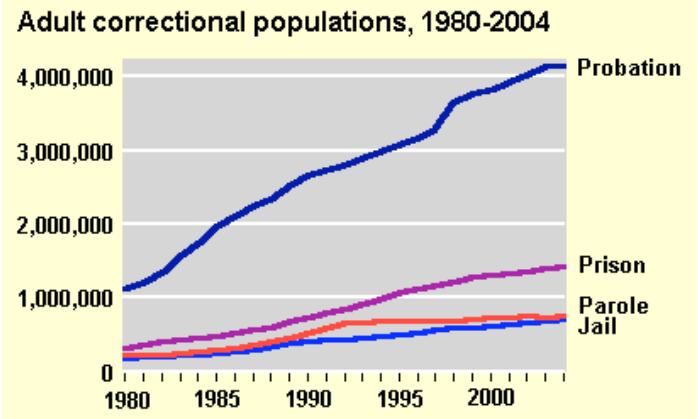
What is the goal of the criminal justice system?

- Rehabilitation

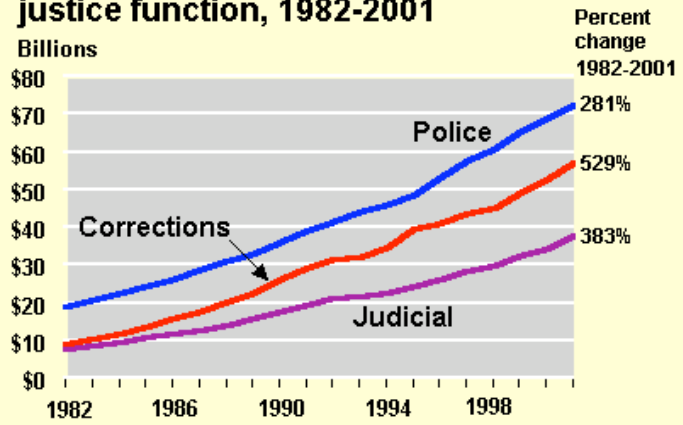
Background

- Prisons are a blunt tool
- Corrections spending has outpaced compared to police over 20 years
- Annual cost of incarceration is \$22,000 per inmate

Then vs. Now

Description

- Device that enables criminal to be tracked more efficiently
- Allows for the sentence of a criminal to be served outside of traditional confinement
- Provides sense of empowerment and accountability
- Sentences are goal oriented and time-based

Components of the Device

- Active GPS Tracker
- Sweat Scan
- Broadcasting Device/ “Scarlet Letter”
- ParoleBot (main system)

Active GPS Tracker

- Track and report exact location of person in real time
- Send data to main system for processing, statistics and distribution

Sweat Monitor

- Automatically test and monitor drug use, run every few hours
- Alert is sent to ParoleBot when positive results are reported

Broadcasting Device/ “Scarlet Letter”

- Sends photo and description of crime committed to any Bluetooth-enabled mobile phone
- Opt-in service for the receiver

ParoleBot

- Heart of Open Parole
- Collects all information and makes accessible to appropriate law enforcement officials
